Item Description

This item request Board approval of Policy Manual changes in Chapter 10.0 - Students.

Overview and Background

The College brings forth a request to update existing policy, Policy 10-02 - Class Participation and Attendance.

Highlights of the policy change are outlined below.

- Statements were added to address class participation and attendance in traditional and online classes.
- The following circumstances were included to the list of justifiable absences: (1) required military duties and (2) serious medical condition and/or incapacitating medical emergency.
- Self-Paced Instruction (SPI) was removed as an alternative format because TCC no longer offers SPI courses
- Hybrid courses were added as an alternative format
- Attendance for adult education and GED courses was added to the policy.

The College has established standards for class participation and attendance by the student.

A. TRADITIONAL CLASSESA

Students enrolled in the courses with traditional formats are expected to attend and/or participate in all registered classes. <u>R</u>-because regular attendance and <u>active regular applicationparticipation</u> constitute the two <u>of the most importantsignificant</u> factors that promote <u>academic</u> success-in college work. <u>A</u>Until midterm during fall and spring terms, any student absent from any class for more time than <u>athat</u> class meets in any one week may be withdrawn by administrative action (AW grade).).

During the summer sessions, similar action may be taken if a student is absent from any day class for-more than two times in Terms A, <u>B or or Term FB</u> or for-more than three times in Term C. Any studentt-absent from any evening class for-more than one evening in Terms A, <u>B</u>, and <u>or Term F,B</u> or for more than two evenings in Term C may also be administratively withdrawn.

Official class attendance begins on the first day of class unless the student registers during the published drop and add period of each term. For students who register during the drop and add window, the official attendance begins on the day the student registers. Students reporting to class late or leaving early may be considered by their instructor to be absent. Students are responsible for completion of all work assigned in class whether they are present or not. In

case of absence, it is the responsibility of the student to contact the instructor.

For absences due to jury duty, court-mandated appearances, <u>required military duties</u>, Collegesponsored activities approved by the <u>Provost or</u> President, <u>religious holidays</u>, or a <u>serious</u> <u>medical condition and/or incapacitating medical emergency or religious holidays</u>, the student must provide prior notification, <u>when appropriate</u>, to the instructor. <u>In addition</u>, <u>s</u>Students may be required to present <u>valid supportive specific</u> documentation upon request. It <u>iswill be</u> the responsibility of the student to <u>notify the instructor in a timely manner and</u> make arrangements with the instructor <u>before the absence</u> to make up any missed assignments.

Students who <u>feel_believe</u> they have been unreasonably denied an educational benefit because of <u>the aforementioned circumstances</u> religious beliefs, jury duty, or other court mandated appearances should contact the <u>appropriate Dean/Director or Office of Vice President for</u> Academic Affairs.

B. COURSES WITH ALTERNATIVE FORMATS

For College courses taught in varied formats to include such as Self-Paced Instruction (SPI), online and hybrid courses television courses, and the distance learning, expectations for participation and progress will vary by delivery mode and will be outlined in the course syllabus. Any student who fails to progress at the minimum level stipulated may be withdrawn by administrative action (AW grade).

C. ADULT EDUCATION AND GED PREPARATION COURSES

Instruction in these areas is individually designed to meet the needs of the student. Class participation requirements will vary based upon delivery mode and course. The College has established standards for class participation and attendance by the student.

A. TRADITIONAL CLASSES

Students are expected to attend and/or participate in all registered classes. Regular attendance and active participation constitute two of the most important factors that promote academic success. Any student absent from any class for more time than a class meets in one week may be withdrawn by administrative action (AW grade).

During the summer sessions, similar action may be taken if a student is absent from any day class more than two times in Terms A, B or F or more than three times in Term C. Any student absent from any evening class more than one evening in Terms A, B, and F, or for more than two evenings in Term C may also be administratively withdrawn.

Official class attendance begins on the first day of class unless the student registers during the published drop and add period of each term. For students who register during the drop and add window, the official attendance begins on the day the student registers. Students reporting to class late or leaving early may be considered by their instructor to be absent. Students are responsible for completion of all work assigned in class whether they are present or not. In case of absence, it is the responsibility of the student to contact the instructor.

For absences due to jury duty, court-mandated appearances, required military duties, Collegesponsored activities approved by the Provost or President, religious holidays, or a serious medical condition and/or incapacitating medical emergency, the student must provide prior notification, when appropriate, to the instructor. In addition, students may be required to present valid supportive documentation upon request. It is the responsibility of the student to notify the instructor in a timely manner and make arrangements to make up any missed assignments.

Students who believe they have been unreasonably denied an educational benefit because of the aforementioned circumstances should contact the appropriate Dean/Director or Office of Academic Affairs.
