CALL TO ORDER

On Monday, October 20, Chair Eugene Lamb called the Tallahassee State College District Board of Trustees meeting to order at 2:30 p.m.

Chair Lamb asked everyone to stand for a moment of silence to honor the memory of Jean English-Hurst, followed by the pledge of allegiance. Jean passed on October 5. She joined the college in 1969 and founded the theatre program. She helped design Turner Auditorium, created the Signature Seat Program to raise funds for the theatre program, and generously established the Ralph and Jean Hurst Collection here at the College.

TRUSTEE COMMENTS

I. Chair Remarks:

Chair Lamb thanked VP Heather Mitchell and her team for the beautiful Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame Dinner and congratulated Jonathan Kilpatrick and Christian Caban on their induction.

II. Trustee Remarks:

- a. Trustee Brown shared that she attended StuFac and described it as an excellent opportunity to interact with the students. She is looking forward to participating again.
- b. Vice Chair Messersmith mentioned that he enjoyed the Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame Dinner, congratulated Trustees Kilpatrick and Caban on their induction, commended the Forensics team for winning a national title, and recognized that TSC was named by the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship (NACCE) as the Entrepreneurial College of the Year.
- c. Trustee Moore echoed praise for the Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame Dinner and congratulated President Murdaugh for receiving the Thinking Outside the Box Award and the Entrepreneurial College of the Year, both from NACCE. She noted that the president was included on Florida Trend magazine's list of the 500 Most Influential Leaders in Florida. She also thanked Dr. Long for an incredible, professional development day at the President's Leadership Institute.
- d. Trustee Caban congratulated all those who were inducted into the TSC Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame. He expressed his honor at being inducted and extended thanks to VP Mitchell and her staff. He also highlighted the significance of the Entrepreneurship College of the Year award.
- e. Trustee Stevens congratulated Trustees Kilpatrick and Caban, as well as the Forensic Team. He also mentioned that the athletic programs are preparing to start their seasons and expressed pride in seeing our student-athletes representing the College.
- f. Trustee Kilpatrick reflected on the meaningfulness of the Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame Dinner and thanked the staff for their efforts. He also commented on the College's social media team for its strong strategic direction and execution.

President Murdaugh thanked the trustees for their kind comments regarding this leadership and the College. He invited Dr. Jennifer Carr, Dean of Student Services, to introduce members of the TSC Student Government Association.

President Murdaugh also shared that the TSC Foundation has launched the Heroes in Healthcare award program, modeled after the successful Heroes in Public Safety initiative. He concluded by asking Amanda Clements, Interim Vice President and Director of Communications, to introduce the College's new Director of Marketing, Mindy Gentry-Stranburg.

Item Description

This item requests Board approval of Policy Manual changes in chapters 0000 – Governance, 1000 – Executive-Administrative-Managerial Professional, 3000 – Noninstructional, 4000 – Program, 5000 – Students, 6000 – Finances, 7000 – Property, and 8000 – Operations.

Overview and Background

The College brings forth a request to modify the College's Policy Manual: revisions of policies within chapters 0000 – Governance, 1000 – Executive-Administrative-Managerial Professional, 3000 – Noninstructional, 4000 – Program, 5000 – Students, 6000 – Finances, 7000 – Property, and 8000 – Operations.

Highlights of these changes include:

0131 - Policymaking - Includes information regarding policymaking notices.

0141 - Board Conflict of Interest - Includes additional standards of ethical conduct outlined in statute.

0164 - Notices of Meetings, Hearings, and Workshops – New policy that outlines notice requirements for meetings, hearings, and workshops of the DBOT.

0169.1 - Public Participation at Board Meetings - Renumbered from 0165 - Clarifies requirements for public input at DBOT meetings.

1115/3115 - Employee Recruitment and Selection - Revises Equity Statement for compliance with DOE.

Expenditures for direct instruction expenses are also recorded in the operating fund.

In accordance with Florida Statutes (1011.01), the Board of Trustees must approve the College's operating fund budget each fiscal year. The College monitors the operating fund activity to ensure approved budget limits are maintained. Additionally, the Board has requested a report of all purchases over \$100,000, but less than \$325,000. The report for the month of October is attached to this item.


